3. Obtain personal leave (if necessary) from the Consultant clinical teacher.
4. follow accepted university procedure for medical leave.

Any failure to follow above guidelines will be reported to higher authorities and serial offenders will face appropriate punishment.

I would like to remind all of you that the training programme is being sustained with utmost difficulty due to Covid-19 outbreak. Therefore the students are expected to play their role responsibly.
